They are among the last pupils to be in this system. These pupils are seven in total that is, Joakim Githinji, Geoffrey Thumbi, Steven Mwangi and Joseph Kamau who are from Moto primary school and the rest which includes Wilson kinuthia and Eunice Muthoni from Kambala primary while Peristers Wambui from St Mary's primary.

Therefore we are glad we were of assistance to them as they exit the program may they shine on their way and their dreams come true.

- We have registered consistent school attendance from the kids.
- We haven't heard any drop out cases, which is an achievement.

- Number of children in the program has increased with four families. Current total number of pupils in the program is 57. However the seven candidates will be exiting the program after their exams.
