Feeding program progressive report

Our progressive feeding program report reveals that the feeding program has been a success, for instance students turn was great showing a positive image of the of the organization. That is the impact it has to the Molo community at large.

As part of a case study we were able to carry out a follow up on one of the student's namely Paul Gachichio. We noted that he has been performing poorly in class however we are working on it. The Covid 19 pandemic affected the normal school calendar for the student and due to this grade four students have not resumed back to class. The calendar indicated that all grade four students will report to school in the month of July. Therefore, in the program we only have six students at Moto and St Mary's primary who are in grade four.

Addition of children in the program: After several home visits we were able to add children into the program. They come from 3 different families and schools as well. That is 4 children are at Moto Primary School, 3 from Kambala Primary School and 2 from St Mary's Primary School.

Students' exit: We were able to exit class 8 students in 3 schools, in Moto primary we exited 4 students, St Mary's primary 1 student and Kambala primary 2 students this is after they sat for their K.C.P.E (Kenya Certificate Primary Education) exams. We are thankful to C.O.M for the support that they have given to the seven students for a period of three years. The seven students performed as follows: Joakim Githinji **307** marks, Eunice Muthoni **238** marks Geoffrey Thumbi **237**, Perister Wambui **228** marks Joseph Kamau **176** marks, Wilson Kinuthia **162** marks and Stephen Mwangi **149** marks, All out of 500 Mark's total.

Achievements.

- There has been a consistent registration of students as well as school attendance.
- 7 students sat for their K.C.P.E therefore exiting the program successfully.
- Total number of children in the program 48.

Repairs: The C.O.M main house roof was repaired due to the fact that there were a few leakages which could have worsened if they were not looked into, later some parts of the ceiling boards were changed after they were damaged by the rains.

New house father: A new house father by the name Peter Njogu was hired to fill in David Thuku's position who was called to the pastoral ministry back in February.

Blessed with a new born calf: This term has bore several fruits one of them being on 14th May 2021, when the organization's cow (Zawadi) calved a heifer named Baraka which means Blessing, therefore this is an indication of increased production of milk in the organization.

Harvesting and planting: We were able to harvest one and a half buckets of potatoes; some cabbages from the C.O.M farm were harvested and used in the meals in a period of two weeks.

We planted carrots, cabbages, spinach, peas, beans, Lucern and Napier grass. Lucern and Napier grass are fodder crops for cow.
