### **INTRODUCTION.**

We thank God for His Faithfulness towards this month (School Year 2021- term one), we've observed his mercies, good health and above all blessing of life. This month had the following activities.

- **FARM REPORT**

We are glad to report that Zawadi the cow and Baraka the calf is doing well and growing healthy. The crops in the farm i.e. beans and peas are doing well and we are planning to harvest them in due time. We appreciate the USA team that visited us in the month of July 2021 as they helped us out in planting some crops such as kale and cabbages. Kudos for the good work the crops are growing fast, and we thank God for that. We also thank God for this month we have been experiencing sufficient rains and due to this farm produce will increase. Zawadi the cow is producing a maximum of 10-15 litres a day and starting this month we have been taking milk to Molo Dairy.

- **REPAIRS/MAINTENANCE**

Last month we had some painting repairs that took place at the Call of Molo main house and the gate. We thank God for the process of painting is done perfectly and it looks beautiful.

- **FEEDING PROGRAM REPORT.**

Currently in our feeding program we have 60 pupils (students) from all the 3 schools. This month one student Mirriam Wangui from Moto Primary withdrew from the program and transferred to a different school in Molo due to family issues. We did revisits to the identified needy children's cases with the help of one of the Advisory Board Member Mr. Maina and we managed to add 6 pupils (students) from one family, from Kambala Primary School.

At Moto Primary School we have 25 pupils (students), Kambala Primary School 16 pupils (students) and St Mary's Mixed Primary School 19 pupils (students). Class four pupils resumed back to school this term as per the new school calendar. This being the first term, pupils graduated to the next class. This year we are blessed to have 11 candidates (8<sup>th</sup> graders) in our program. We pray for God's guidance, understanding, breakthrough and favor upon them. The Call of Molo is blessed to have 4 students in Secondary School (High School) and that is an indication of growth and God's blessing. Previous year we had two Secondary School kids, namely: Paul Gachichio from Njenga Karume Secondary School and Monicah Wanjiru from Molo Highway Secondary School. This year Geoffrey Thumbi joined Molo Secondary School, he has been a student of Moto and he has been our feeding program since he was in grade 6. His mother passed away 5 years ago, and his Father abandoned him and his brother alone 2 years ago. No one has been able to trace his father ever since. We've been following up on his case and God is faithful up to this far. He scored 237 marks in his 2020 K.C.P.E (Kenya Certificate of Primary Education). We thank God he is currently in school with all the needed requirements and first term school fees fully paid thanks to his sponsor. Paul's brother Peter Macharia form 3 (junior high) student who goes to school at Turi Secondary School in Molo was enrolled in the program. He had school arrears which had led him to miss classes when he was sent home for lack of school fees. We thank everyone who have blessed these children with a lifetime investment of education.
