James Muturi, Philomena Nduta and Ruth Wanjiru were enrolled in the Call of Molo feeding program in April 2019. We came to know them through their family friend within Molo, who is aware of our organization offering hope to the vulnerable children within Molo. James is in class 2 while Philomena is in class 1 and Ruth is an Ecde (Early Childhood Development Education) pupil (student) in St. Mary's mixed Primary School

This family is blessed with a single parent after the father passed away a few years ago leaving her as the sole provider. During the home assessment process we found out that the mother is the sole provider of her five children she is also the guardian to her two sisters, Mary Nyambura and Peristers Wambui and are students in St. Mary's mixed primary school. They are in class 7 and 8 respectively. The family is going through a tough time, as the mother, earns meager earnings to sustain her large family. The mother is grateful that her children are in the Call of Molo feeding program.

We also discovered that the mother was struggling healthwise and has depression due to family struggles to provide her families basic needs. Call of Molo has helped this mother find counseling services for free and we continue to visit her as often as we can for moral and Spiritual support. We hope and pray things will turn out well and she will receive some hope moving forward.

These children have been in the Call of Molo feeding program for a period of one year plus and we have seen a tremendous change in them. They look healthier now than the initial day of enrollment. We have seen a positive improvement in their psychosocial behavior and also an improvement in their academics and we thank God for giving us this opportunity to have them in our program, thanks to our donors endless support.

A quick follow up on the Sister's Perister and Mary, showed that, Perister in class 8 skips classes sometimes, her teachers thinks it's peer pressure from the other teens, Mary on the other hand attends classes without fail and there is hope in her academics. Perister is receiving counseling therapy over her school attendance issues.

Some of the challenges the family is experiencing are;

- Financial constrains
- Single parenting social tauter, absence of the father figure in the family.
